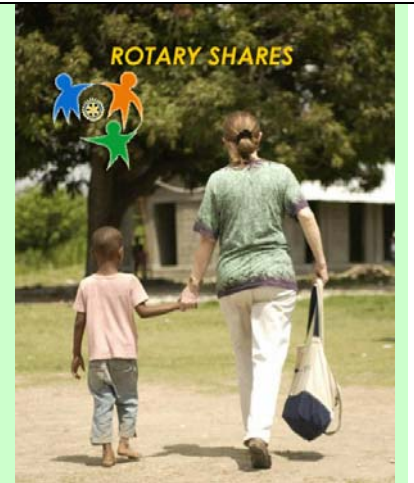


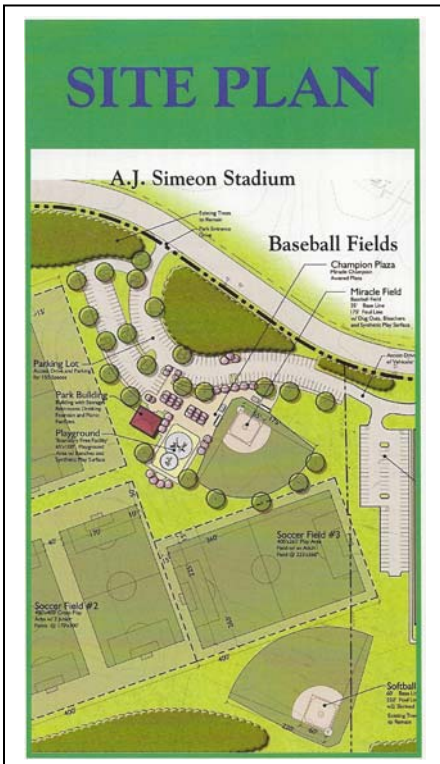

Allen Oliver and Scott Tilley are promoting the development of a Miracle Field to be constructed in the A.J. Simeon Stadium complex. Miracle Field and Miracle League provides an opportunity

for children with disabilities to participate in baseball. The High Point facility will be the third such facility in North Carolina. Over 15,000 children in the 8-county "Triad" area could benefit from this program. Parks & Recreation and the Kiwanis club are hoping that Rotary clubs in the area will join in the funding of this effort.



The field consists of a flat obstruction-free rubberized representation of a baseball field that will provide a safe playing field for children who are unable to participate in a baseball program because of a handicap.
