Hero's Day & Shirlee Carda Fairview Scholarships Awarded Today

At its June 2 meeting Furnitureland Rotary Club recognized four city employees at it's 2007-2008 Hero's Day celebration.



Police Chief Jim Fealy introduced two officers from the High Point Police Department: Christopher O'Toole and Sarah Hester to receive recognition at Furnitureland Rotary Club's Heroes Day. Chief Fealy told of a major disturbance which involved a homicide to which the officers were dispatched. The officers reaction and immediate involvement in administering first aide and medical assistance saved the life of a victim of life-threatening stab wounds. Chief Fealy pointed out that police officers are only minimally trained in providing medical assistance yet their intervention saved the man's life.



Fire Chief David Taylor: Captain Kelly Grooms and Captain Bobby Fuller brought new life to a languishing Guilford County program "VIP for a VIP" (Vehicle Injury Prevention). This program is aimed at high school juniors and seniors to try to help them make better decisions while driving. Not only have they revitalized this program in the High Point and Guilford County high schools, but they have taken the program state-wide. The program involves spending a day in each high school with the juniors and seniors. They try to visit every school at least once every two years. Chief Taylor recounted the following story that resulted from the program last year when a student who had participated in the training asked to meet with the principal of his school. At that meeting the student tol the principal that his father had bought him an exotic sports car. He gave the keys to the principal with the explanation that "...what I found out this morning is that I am not equipt, I don't have the skills yet to drive that vehicle." Chief Taylor attributes this program to the elimination of fatal teenage crash recently.
